



CHAIRPERSON AND TREASURERS REPORT 2019 TO 2020

This year's fundraising has been very unusual due to Covid 19. We started the year in a positive way but six months down the line this was cut short.

Despite this we have achieved most of our objectives and had a very successful six months of fundraising.

Here are some of the events that we have covered:

- ❖ Macmillan coffee morning which included cake sales in which we raised £330.25 for the charity
- ❖ Pumpkin colouring competition with a prize for one girl and one boy in each class.
- ❖ Year 2 Autumn disco
- ❖ Christmas Light Switch On
- ❖ Christmas magic show
- ❖ Year 1 Mad Hatters Party

We have approached other avenues of fundraising which included organising Christmas gifts, raffles and Mother's Day gifts.

FOMS have donated this year to the school a whole new reading scheme which includes books for all pupils in line with new updated guidelines. We have also donated a camera, chicks for Year R so they could watch them hatch and grow and Christmas gifts from Santa given to each pupil.

FOMS as a team have also supported the school with in house events such as book fairs, providing tea and coffee for the wider community at school productions and other events, Year 2 graduation and leavers party.

We were also present at new parents evening and help with the sale of second hand uniforms.

FOMS have assisted and represented the school at the HI-5 events to enable us be jointly involved with the five schools. We have benefitted greatly from this with the funds raised.

We have enrolled the school with the Easy Fundraising scheme and Name Tags For You from which FOMS earn commission. Also we have been in contact with a local recycling firm who takes the milk bottle tops.

We started the year with a bank balance of £2,753.51 and £31.05 in the petty cash tin.

Throughout the six months the income was £5,353.03 with an expenditure of £5,398.43 and a total of £1,670.19 of profit raised.

The donations of new books for the reading scheme, Year R chicks and camera amounted to £3,543.98.

From a financial point of view the Christmas Light Switch On was a very profitable event for the school with a profit of £577.98.

The bank balance stands at £2,853.73 with £31.05 in the petty cash tin.

The school would like us to donate some funds to purchase a buddy bench which is being sourced at present.
