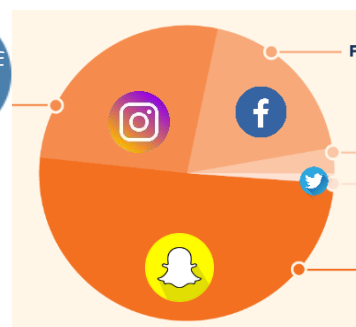

GOOD POINTS

1. In a lot of ways Instagram mimics Facebook, except it's faster to scroll, a lot less video's and visually is aimed at the younger generations (25 and under)
2. Instagram has removed the "like count" for posts, so you can no longer see how many likes you get for a post, as they identified an unhealthy obsession with the numbers.
3. The reporting system is easy, and relatively responsive
4. Making an account private has been simplified significantly in the last two years.



BAD POINTS

1. It is very easy to have a private and public account from the same email, easily hiding your private account from prying eyes.
2. Instagram has many "bot" accounts, which are robots setup to like / comment / follow on your account to boost your numbers. Users pay for this to happen.
3. Instagram has a well-documented problem with self-harm and suicide content easily accessible to any user.
4. Instagram has ads, which influence where they go to on the internet next
